Finding lost women – connecting community through family. Do you have a story about a grandmother or great-grandmother who moved to live in her husband's home community, and do you know where she grew up? Please contact us and tell her story. It is as simple as that.

The Family History Society of Newfoundland and Labrador (FHSNL) will hold meetings to explore the migratory patterns of women in Conception Bay. Women, when they married, changed their surnames and often moved to their husband's community, making these women difficult to track over time. By interviewing people in each of our target communities, we believe that we will find and help re-establish links between families and communities in Conception Bay.

We invite town councils, heritage groups, museums, libraries, women's and senior's groups, and individuals to contact us to arrange meetings in communities in Conception Bay.
